Dan grew up in the Dominican Republic as a missionary kid and returned there as a single missionary in 1999. He met Barbara, who grew up in Martinsburg, PA shortly before leaving for the mission field. He returned to the U.S. in December of 2000 in order to get married, with the intention of returning together to the D.R. as missionaries. While Barbara was in language school, she began having serious health issues, which prevented them from being able to return to the mission field. After 6 years in secular work and 7 years in the pastorate, God once again opened the door and renewed the call to the Dominican Republic. Dan and Barbara will be working with the existing churches in the Dominican Republic, helping them prepare and send out their own people as church planters and missionaries. Dan will also be helping to start a business in the Dominican Republic, which will provide an avenue through which to establish relationships and begin to have a spiritual influence in the business community and the upper-class. This class of people have been identified as the least-reached group in the Dominican Republic.


